Weekend College

- Launched in fall semester 2022
- Seven-week terms (two per semester with one-week break in between)
- Hybrid format
 - Classes meet four times on Friday evenings or Saturday mornings/afternoons
 - Class length: 3 3.5 hours
 - Remainder of course work is asynchronous
- Students may attend in person or via Zoom
- Classes guaranteed to run regardless of enrollment
- Courses also offered for Rural College Consortium

WMORGAN COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Weekend College

- Designed to meet needs of adult learners
 - More likely to work full- or part-time and to support a family
 - Barriers: work schedules, daycare, household budget, food insecurity, transportation, technology needs
- Flexible scheduling on weekends
- Combination of synchronous and asynchronous offers flexibility while fostering connections with instructor and classmates

Weekend College

Associate of Arts Track

- Complete 60-credit degree in two years only on weekends
- Comp I and II every fall
- Math course every spring
- Variety of electives and core requirements –
 Most popular: Psychology, English Comp,
 Geography, Philosophy

Early Childhood Education Certificates

- Stackable Certificates
 - ECE Assistant
 - ECE Infant/Toddler Teacher
 - Early Childhood Teacher
 - Early Childhood Education Director

Classes Offered - Students Served

Since launch in Fall 2022:

- 19 GT courses for the AA track
- 21 courses in the ECE certificate tracks
- Taught by 13 part-time instructors and 9 full-time faculty
- 246 students enrolled across all classes

2022-2023 (including summer 2023): 57 students in GT classes/63 students in ECE classes**

2023-2024: 75 students in GT classes/51 students in ECE classes

**ECE 1011 and 1031 tuition and fees paid through state funding

Spring 2024 -- \$150 Stipends to Lessen Barriers

- Each student who attended a minimum of the first two synchronous classes received a living stipend (for one class only) to help defray costs of childcare, transportation, food, etc.
- Total of 39 stipend recipients
 - Of those, 23 students were adult learners (aged 25+)
 - Ages ranged from 17 to 61
 - Demographics
 - 15 students Hispanic/Latino/Latinx
 - 4 students Black non-Hispanic
 - 10 students White non-Hispanic



Fall 2024 plans

- Continue supporting adult learners
 - Weekend college classes
 - Food Pantry and Thanksgiving baskets
 - Incorporation of fresh local produce
 - Stipends to reduce non-academic barriers
 - Advertising about Weekend College

Importance of Weekend College for Adult Learners
